Comprehension: (In other words, what does it say?)

What are the main themes in these chapters?

Interpretation: (In other words, what does it mean?)

To judge or not to judge? When is it appropriate? We will be the judge of this world and will judge angels?

Why is it important for us as Christians to resolve disputes between ourselves and how is it possible to resolve these disputes?

Who will inherit the kingdom of God and who won't? What is the main difference between these 2 groups?

How is sexual sin different from other sins?

Why does Paul concede that people should marry? But why does he say it's good not to marry?

Why does Paul point out in 7:10 that a command comes from the Lord but then what he writes in verse 12 is coming from him, not the Lord? Does this mean it's debatable?

Are there any reasons biblical reasons that a marriage can be broken? What does Paul advocate?

Application: (In other words, how do I apply this to my life?)

Would you rather be wronged or cheated than take a fellow sister or brother to court?

Why does Paul write so much about marriage?

How can these teachings be applied to your marriage? If you're single, does it change your views on wanting to get married?
