Comprehension: (In other words, what does it say?)
What are the themes in this chapter?
Interpretation: (In other words, what does it mean?)
As we remain in our earthly tents, what transpires? What happens to us as we become confident Christians?
We will all appear before the judgement seat of Christ. What will we be judged on? Explain the difference between judgment and salvation:
What is it to "fear the Lord"? What are Paul's motives to share the gospel? Is it 'fear' as we understand fear?
Verse 14 says "one died for all, therefore all died". What is the assumption about people in this verse?
What does reconciliation mean in this context?
How is being an ambassador of Christ a huge responsibility? What is involved?
Application: (In other words, how do I apply this to my life?)
Paul writes that "in Christ we are a new creation, the old is gone, the new has come" but is it as clean as that? Do temptations and desires of the flesh just vanish? Are there things you still struggle with?
God exchanged our sin for His righteousness, how is that a good deal for Him? How can we be the righteousness of God? Does it motivate you to continue to serve Him well or even better?
Is there a difference in giving God a place in your life and giving God the totality of your life?
