Application: (In other words, how do I apply this to my life?)

In the beginning of chapter 6 Paul lists out different hardships he has been faced with. What hardships do you face because you're a Christian? How do you get through them?

Have you been in a situation of 'conflicts on the outside, fears within' (v.5b)? Has God been your comforter? In what ways?
