Reflection:

Describe your spiritual birthright in Jesus. In what ways could you be guilty of 'selling (or trading) your birthright' for temporary pleasures?

People are watching believers always! Pagan King Abimelech criticizes Isaac for lying about his relationship with Rebekah. What do people see when they watch you? Do you live in a manner worthy of the gospel?
