

Jeremiah 30-45 discussion questions:

1. Jer. 31:21 talks about road markers and guideposts. Think of these not as just physical markers but spiritual ones. Name some of the spiritual markers in your life. These can be events, places, and even people. (I will give an example of this in the lesson so that everyone will understand.) Ask for volunteers to share their spiritual markers. This will most likely spur more thoughts for everyone. Keep their spiritual markers in their Bibles or somewhere special. They may even want to go home and journal about their spiritual markers. Think how great it would be to know the spiritual markers of your parents. So, pass this down to your children and grandchildren, either verbally or in written form. Pray that God will continue to put spiritual markers in your life.
2. What is the new covenant spoken of in 31:31-34?
3. Jeremiah was innocent, yet thrown in prison, stocks, and beaten on multiple occasions. He was also thrown in a miry pit (ch. 38). Do you know someone who is in the pit and needs a rope? Are you willing to gather the forces, put forth the effort, get a little dirty if needed and pull them out? Or perhaps you are in the pit. Do you need help out?
4. Do you believe that God is Lord and Creator? Do you obey Him in all areas of your life?
5. God had to tear down Israel and Judah in order to build them back up and restore them. Has this ever taken place in your life?
