

## **ACTS Chapter 1:**

**Comprehension** – What stood out to you in this chapter?

### **Interpretation**

What is the one last command that Jesus gives the disciples? (v 8)

Verse 14 offers a little insight into the earliest Christians' lives, what was their focus? (v14)

Why was it important to replace Judas? And why was it important that the replacement be a witness to everything Jesus had done? (v21-22) There is a subtle change of words here, from disciple to apostle, what's the difference?

### **Application**

Why is it so important to receive the Holy Spirit? How do you know if you have?

Jesus will return, should we be looking up in the sky waiting for him? (v7-11) What does he want us to be doing with our time here?

## **Acts Chapter 2**

**Comprehension** – What stood out to you in this chapter?

### **Interpretation**

Is it coincidental that the Holy Spirit came on them on Pentecost?

Peter is boldly speaking out in verses 14-39, what do you attribute this new 'standing firm/bold' attitude of his to?

### **Application**

The people were 'cut to the heart' by Peter's words and asked "what shall we do" in verse 37. Are you ever cut to the heart because of your sin? Do you know what to do when this happens?

There are more early church examples in the end of chapter 2. In what ways do you see similarities to your church? Are you contributing in "glad and sincere" ways to help your church be a healthy, loving place that is inviting to all?
