Application: (In other words, how do I apply this to my life?)

Verse 11 says the priest stood day after day and offered the same sacrifices, "which can never take away sins". What are we doing in the name of religion that doesn't make an eternal impact or something that we think is for God but may not actually be pleasing God?

As parents, we must often remind our kids to 'let us handle it' when they're in a situation and we need to interject ourselves as their advocate, to keep them from getting hurt, or into a fight, or lose a friend, or confront someone for a wrong doing – so that it can be handled in an adult, mature fashion. Do you see how God may view us in the same light? God says, 'it is mine to avenge, and I will repay', Do you trust God, knowing that He's got this even if it doesn't look like it from where you're standing?

When you feel wronged or attacked:

- Are you able to restrain from verbally assaulting family or friends or strangers?
- Do you lash out on social media or do you repost a lot of toxicity?
- Look for your hope in a political party to solve all the things wrong with society?
