

John Chapter 6 Discussion Questions

1. John 6:1-15 Feeding the 5000

*** Comprehension:** (What does it say?)

Who are the main characters? How many others are there?

Where does this take place?

Who provides the fish and loaves?

What does Jesus do before distributing the food?

*** Interpretation:** (What does it mean?)

Who does Jesus question about providing the food and why?

Do you think the disciples took the food from the boy or did he freely give it?

Can you imagine how this kid must have felt afterwards?

*** Application:** (How do I apply this to my life?)

Do you make a habit of giving thanks before meals? How about in public?

Have you had an experience where God used a little “something” and multiplied it?

In what ways are we selfish with our requests of God? Do we also desire more of the physical and material help than of the spiritual?

2. John 6:22-59 I AM the Bread of Life Discourse (sermon)

*** Comprehension:** (What does it say?)

Who is Jesus giving this discourse on the bread of life to and why?

How is Jesus relating the miracle feeding to his own mission?

*** Interpretation:** (What does it mean?)

What does Jesus mean when he says “I am the bread of life?” (v. 35) What is he claiming with that I AM statement?

How does this bread compare with the manna of Moses’ day?

What does Jesus mean as he calls the bread his flesh and says in v. 53 **“Truly, truly, I say to you, unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, you have no life in you.”**

*** Application:** (How do I apply this to my life?)

In light of who Jesus is and what he said, what should my response or action be?

3. John 6:60-71

*** Comprehension:** (What does it say?)

What was the response to Jesus’ Bread of Life sermon?

*** Interpretation:** (What does it mean?)

How do you think people would respond to a message like that today?

*** Application:** (How do I apply this to my life?)

Do you believe in the living bread?

Do you feed on the Word of God daily for your spiritual growth and well-being?

If you don’t have a daily habit of reading your Bible, are you willing to start?
