Paul demonstrates in the final chapter that he is not only passionate about doing God's work, he's also very passionate about the people he surrounds himself with and he is very invested in their lives. Do you relate to the way he lived his life? In what ways are you invested in the lives of fellow believers (or could you be invested)?
