

Romans 9-11 Questions

Comprehension: (In other words, what does it say?)

What are the main themes in these chapters?

What was the context in which Paul wrote these chapters?

Interpretation: (In other words, what does it mean?)

Chapter 9 begins intensely and is quite a shift from where we left off in chapter 8. What does the first part of chapter 9 tell us about Paul's heart for both the Jews and the Gentiles?

What are some of the questions that Paul brings up throughout chapter 9?

Where does true righteousness come from? How do you submit to God's righteousness?

Romans 10:9-13 gives a clear statement of the gospel, how would you write these verses in your own words?

Who did Paul consider himself to be an apostle to and what was he also trying to achieve through his mission?

What does the doxology at the end of Romans 11 mean and what is it telling you?

Application: (In other words, how do I apply this to my life?)

God is described as both kind and stern in Chapter 11, how can He be both? Does/should that alter the way you approach God or approach living out your life?

Does your heart yearn for a certain person in your life to be saved?

Search your own heart, are you saved or are you "seeking to establish your own (righteousness)"?
